AIDA Cruises: Record Donations for Aid to the Philippines AIDA guests and crew donate over €223,700 for victims of the typhoon Haiyan

After the typhoon Haiyan caused severe destruction in the Philippines in November of 2013, guests and crew members of AIDA Cruises responded with tremendous generosity. With the initiative "AIDA Help for the Philippines" and the annual New Year's raffle on board the AIDA fleet, the cruise line collected total donations of over €223,700 for the victims of the typhoon Haiyan. With proceeds from the traditional New Year's raffle on board the ships, AIDA has been supporting children's aid projects all over the world for many years. Many crew members on board AIDA's ships come from the Philippines. Around 800 of them come from the most severely affected regions. The result of the raffle exceeded all expectations, including those of crew members. The crew on AIDAstella was so moved by the guests' generosity that it spontaneously came up with a personal thank you. Club director Heiko Schliek explains, "A Philippine choir with colleagues from all departments – machines, deck, show ensemble, housekeeping, kitchen, restaurant, bar, etc. – sang for our guests on the pool deck. It was truly a very special and highly emotional moment that I have never experienced before."
